Funding Policy 2012/2013 for Short Track Speed Skating

World Championships

SISA will provide support to athletes in the national / national development team who participate in the ISU World Championships. SISA will assist in the accommodation and air travel arrangements with a minimum of basic funding subsidy for airfare. Participation in the World Championships is subjected to the number of entries one skater per category, and skaters must achieve the minimum qualifying times for World Championships for Men and Ladies 500m of <49s and <51s respectively as stated in ISU Communication1746.

World Cup Competitions

The following World Cup competitions have been identified and shortlist by SISA to receive funding support:

- ISU World Cup Short Track, Nagoya Japan
- ISU World Cup Short Track, Shanghai China

SISA will assist in the air travel arrangement through SSC official appointed travel agent. Minimum basic funding subsidy for airfare will be accorded to athletes in the national / national development team who satisfy ISU Rule 108 on age entry requirement and achieve stipulated SISA Men and Ladies performance selection qualifying times for 500m of <58s and <64s respectively.

Athletes in the national / national development team who satisfy ISU Rule 108 but do not meet the SISA Men and Ladies performance selection qualifying times may be considered, subjected to the number of entries submitted for the competition per member country. The said athletes will be self-funded for the competition.

Participation in the World Cup competitions is subjected to the final approval, and at the discretion, of the Team Coach and SISA Executive Committee.



World Junior Championships

Minimum basic funding subsidy for airfare will be accorded to athletes in the national / national development team who satisfy ISU Rule 108 on age entry requirement and achieve stipulated SISA Junior Men and Junior Ladies performance selection qualifying times for 500m of <60s and <70s respectively.

Athletes in the national / national development team who satisfy ISU Rule 108 but do not meet the SISA Junior Men and Junior Ladies performance selection qualifying times may be considered, subjected to the number of entries submitted for the competition per member country. The said athletes will be self-funded for the competition.

Participation in the World Junior Championships is subjected to the final approval, and at the discretion, of the Team Coach and SISA Executive Committee.
